Concept Note and Agenda

The technical segment of the Global Protection Forum (annex 1) is dedicated to **field cluster coordinators, AoRs coordinators, co-coordinators and IMOs** and aims to:

- Plan and prepare key cluster processes for 2021 (HNO/HRP, protection analysis, localization).
- Stimulate cross-learning between teams and across regions, fostering transversal communication and collaboration.
- Gain and share information and knowledge.

The programme of the technical segment reflects the needs expressed by coordinators through a quick survey conducted among field protection clusters (annex 2) as well as consultations with Global AoRs and the GPC Coordinator. Sessions are organized jointly by the GPC Operation's Cell and the global AoRs, with contributions from field operations and partners.

13:00-13:45 Opening of the Global Protection Forum 2021 and launch of the GPC's virtual exhibition by the Global Coordinators

11:00-12:30 Donor engagement and coordinating fundraising

<u>Objective</u>: review good practices on donor engagement and discuss ways to ensure better coordination of donor engagement and fundraising for HRPs.







12:00-14:00 Collective Learning

<u>Objective</u>: Strengthen our collective learning efforts through building interactive learning mechanisms and opportunities. This session will guide our joint learning approach and ensure an effective humanitarian response with protection at its core.

14:30-16:00 Core joint session: HNO/HRP

<u>Objective</u>: present the steps for the HCP 2021, discuss lessons learnt from the 2020 process and identify opportunities to deliver comprehensive analysis.

14:30-16:00 **Core Joint Session: localization**

<u>Objective</u>: (i) discuss the extent to which local actors are currently engaging in the areas of leadership and humanitarian funding, through showcasing the operations that have advanced the localization agenda in their funding or leadership systems; (ii) encourage the Protection and AoR coordinators to enhance the participation and collaboration of local and national actors in the coordination and delivery of protection responses.

16:00-17:30 Implementation of protection from sexual exploitation and abuses (PSEA) with robust victim assistance by Protection Clusters and its AoRs

<u>Objective</u>: (i) Increase Coordinator's understanding of PSEA with a focus on challenges, gaps and promising practices in regard to victim assistance at the field level; (ii) Discuss the role and collaboration between HC leadership, PSEA Networks and GBV subcluster, Child Protection and Protection Coordinators







Thursday 15th April

Time Sessions

11:00-12:30 Centrality of protection

<u>Objective</u>: promote a clear understanding of the centrality of protection and address practical challenges that protection actors may face in its implementation within the protection cluster/sector and beyond, including in their work with development and peace actors.

14:30-16:00 Core Joint Session: Protection Analytical Framework

<u>Objective</u>: launch the PAF and present how it should guide protection analysis in support of strategic planning processes (HNO/HRP, Common country analysis, regular protection analysis report, advocacy pieces, etc.).

Annex 1

GPC 2021 GLOBAL PROTECTION FORUM CONCEPT NOTE

12-16 April 2021

Background

Each year, the Global Protection Cluster (GPC), its Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) Members including the Areas of Responsibility (AoRs) organize a Global Protection Forum with partners and field coordinators to review gaps, challenges and opportunities in protection coordination, discuss emerging protection challenges and solutions, and plan activities to be undertaken to ensure centrality and mainstreaming of protection at global and field levels.

In response to the feedback received after the <u>Global Forum 2020</u> pointing out towards the need for a streamlined programme and the organization of technical sessions dedicated specifically to field cluster coordinators, the GPC adopted a slightly different format than the previous year (see GPC calendar attached). Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2021 editions of the Forum with take place exclusively in digital form. The programme will include the following elements:

A technical segment (12-16 April) dedicated to field cluster coordinators, AoRs coordinators, cocoordinators and IMOs consisting of virtual workshops of 90 min each and aiming at fostering cross learning and collaboration across regions and agencies.

A *temperature check* event (June date tbc) aimed at reviewing the funding level of the protection sector in 2021 against the requirements put forward in the Global Humanitarian Overview 2020 and draw attention to underfunded operations or specialized protection areas.

A thematic segment (13-17 September) dedicated to the broader constituency of the GPC and designed to foster dialogue on current protection priorities, discuss emerging issues and present new evidence and good practice.

A <u>High-Level event</u> (30th of November) organized on the eve of the GHO launch and aimed at drawing attention to the funding level of the protection sector in the Humanitarian Response Plans across all cluster operations and mobilize resource for the protection sector in 2022.

A specific agenda and concept note will be developed for each segment/event of the Forum.

Participation

Participants will include global and field coordinators of the Protection Cluster including the AoRs, cocoordinators, and IMOs, key donors, SAG members, GPC Task Team coordinators and members, GPC members, local actors, as well as human rights, development, and peace actors. Specific target audience will be identified for each event.

Organisation

The Forum will be organized jointly by the Operation's Cell and the AoRs following consultation with the field operations. The GPC SAG will approve the strategic direction of the Forum and support the organization.








<u>Annex 2</u> - Results of the quick survey conducted amongst 32 field protection clusters/sectors in February 2021
