Centrality of Protection?

"Protection of all persons affected and at risk must inform humanitarian decision-making and response, including engagement with States and non-State parties to conflict. It must be central to our preparedness efforts, as part of immediate and life-saving activities, and throughout the duration of humanitarian response and beyond."

—IASC

IASC requires <u>all</u> humanitarian actors to work together to understand and seek to prevent, mitigate, or end the risks of violence, coercion, and deliberate deprivation that people affected by conflict or disasters face.

UNDERLYING COP PRINCIPLES



HC/HCTs are responsible for leading the collective strategic protection response.



Identifying and reducing protection risks must be understood first and foremost from the perspective of crisis-affected people.



Wide-ranging
partnerships
are essential
to mitigate
multifaceted
protection risks to
affected people.



Regular and consistent engagement with duty bearers is critical to reducing protection risks.

HOW TO ACHIEVE PROTECTION OUTCOMES



CHALLENGES ENABLERS

Leadership takes responsibility; policies and guidance in Reluctance to engage with place for armed actor engagement. Undertaking proper stakeholder mapping and analysis as armed actors on protection well as a conflict sensitivity analysis. Fear of legal ramifications Regular staff trainings and briefings. of engaging with NSAGs Lack of sustained engagement Proper handovers of relationships. with armed actors Expertise leveraged insufficiently Learn and build on what works in the field and match expertise. Lack of diverse and collective approach Develop common protection approaches. Consistent and regular engagement with armed actors. Perception of not being seen as neutral Emphasise humanitarian principles. Lack of presence and proximity to Expand reach by supporting local organization's affected populations and affected communities' engagement efforts.
